# PALM DESERT CHOREOGRAPHY FESTIVAL **27 YEARS OF DANCE EXCELLEN**

The Palm Desert Choreography Festival, the desert's premier celebration of dance, returns to the McCallum Theatre stage for its 27th year on Saturday, November 9, at 7 p.m. and Sunday, November 10, at 4 p.m. This highly anticipated festival is a dynamic platform for emerging and established choreographers to showcase their talents while engaging new audiences in the Coachella Valley.

The festival is unique in its mission to highlight dance as an art form and to provide a space for dancemakers to share their creative works with the public. Twenty-five talented choreographers from the night. The highlight of the evening across the nation have been selected to present their work in two distinctive performances over the weekend. These choreographers, chosen from submissions across the country and abroad, will compete in a choreography competition split into two divisions, offering dance enthusiasts a chance to witness a diverse

range of styles and performances.

Beyond the performances, the festival offers educational opportunities, such as workshops and residencies, to inspire and support the next generation of choreographers and dancers. The event also celebrates those who have made significant contributions to the world of dance, ensuring that this art form continues to grow and thrive.

The City of Palm Desert and the Palm Desert Housing Authority offer programs to encourage prospective income-qualified households with low to moderate incomes to achieve first-time homeownership. By joining our interest list, you'll be the first to know when affordable homes become available.

To qualify, household income must not exceed 120% of Riverside County's area median income (currently \$97,500 for a family of four). Applicants should have good credit, some savings, a consistent employment history, and be able to secure a pre-approved loan from a lender. Homes are typically resale units priced between \$170,000 and \$290,000.

## FREE DOCUMENT SHREDDING EVENT

The City of Palm Desert, in partnership with Burrtec Waste and Recycling Services, is offering free document shredding services to help residents and businesses securely dispose of sensitive documents such as tax records, legal documents, and bank statements, on Friday, November 22, and Saturday, November 23, from 7:30 – 11:30 a.m., or until the collection trucks are full.

This drive-through, drop-off event is taking place at Palm Desert City Hall, 73510 Fred Waring Drive. No appointments are needed, and signs will be posted directing participants to the drop off location.

Accepted items include stapled and bound office paper, glossy paper, photos, file folders, and envelopes. While paper clips are allowed, binder clips and notebooks will not be accepted. Residents and businesses are limited to ten boxes per day, and boxes and bags will not be returned. Please ensure that any hazardous materials, such as batteries and potentially flammable liquids, are removed from bags and boxes before drop-off.
