State Individual Assistance – PDA

- Verifies scope and severity of damages (homes, businesses, agriculture)
- Information used to determine feasibility of requesting federal assistance (SBA, FEMA, etc.)

U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) Disaster Loans

Types of SBA Declarations

Physical: low-interest loans for damaged property

> Economic: low-interest working capital loans



SBA Physical Declaration

Criteria: ≻25 homes and/or businesses

Each suffering uninsured losses of at least 40%



Physical Disaster Loans

Homeowners/Renters:

\$40k repair/replacement of personal property
 \$200k repair/replacement of a primary residence

Businesses:

\$2M repair/replacement of real estate, machinery/ equipment, inventory and/or working capital to continue operations

SBA Economic Declaration



Criteria:

Five or more small businesses

Economic Injury Loans

Businesses

\$2M for economic injury

Provides working capital to continue day to day business operations

Includes small non-farm businesses and small agricultural cooperatives

Provides additional eligible losses based on FEMA inspection

> No duplication of benefits
